What We Cannot Do

- Give legal advice
- Provide housing/Shelter

Intake Process

- Client will meet with an advocate
- Initial intake can average approximately 1 to 2 hrs.
- A risk (lethality) assessment is completed for IPV
- Advocate is listening for purpose of visit
- Advocate provides information and options including safety planning
- Advocate connects client to resources, referrals, and agencies if requested ("warm hand-off" if needed)
- No waitlist for advocate help, potential waitlist for counseling

Nampa Family Justice Center Referral Process

- All services are at **no cost** to clients
- Walk-ins are welcomed but may have to wait if an advocate is not available

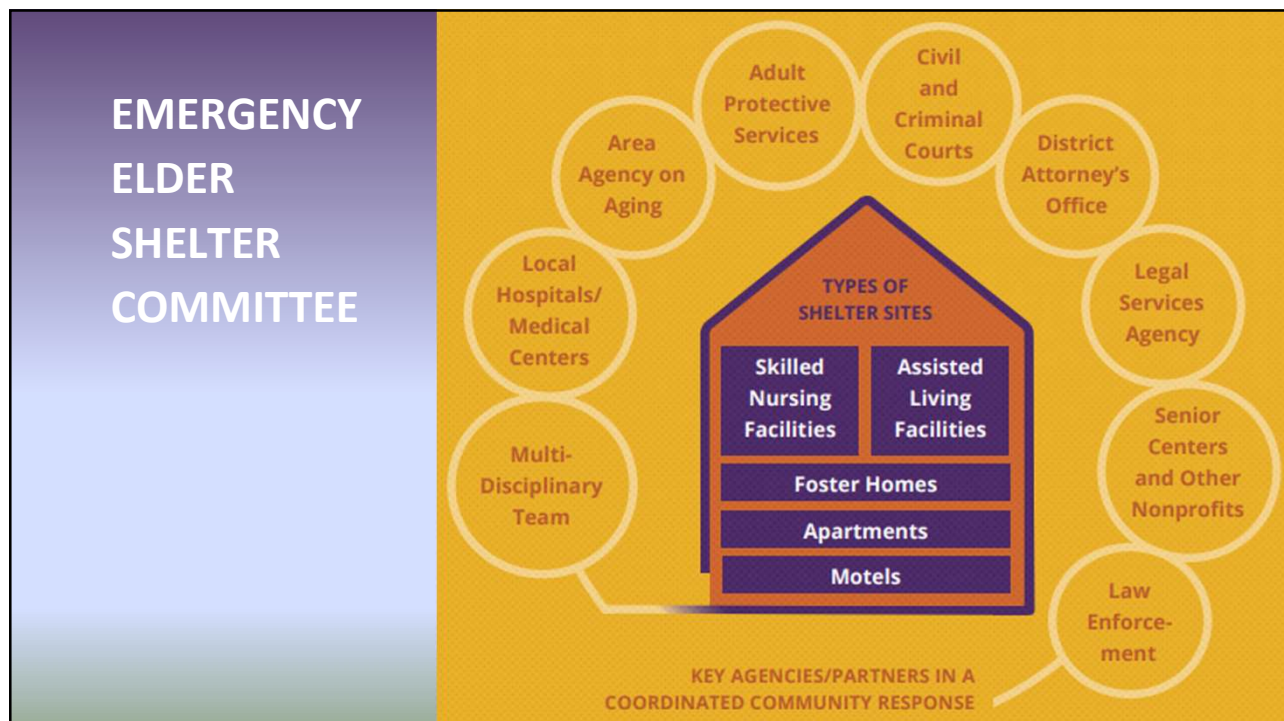
Coordinated Community Response (CCR) To Elder Abuse, Neglect, & Financial Exploitation
